## Aim

- The Certificate in Community Development provides a part-time programme for those who wish to train as community development practitioners, able to work alongside leaders in the community in effective development strategies.

## Admission Requirements

- Matriculation exemption or equivalent
- Age exemption (Senior Certificate and a minimum of 22 years of age)
- 40 years of age and over without any school certificate

## Time Commitment

- Classes are held on campus as three block releases of one week each
- Two block releases in year 1 and one in year 2 followed by the Practical
- Work between contact sessions are by e-learning platform and in virtual study groups
- Programme commences 12 July 2010

## Cost

- R150 per credit module
- Approximate annual cost: R9 900 (66 credits)
